The Sahitya Akademi for Yuva Puraskar in 23 languages, and Bal Sahitya Puraskar for 22 languages were announced on June 14. Malayalam writer Malayath Appunni and Tamil writer Devi Nachiappan aka Deivanai won Bal Sahitya awards for their contribution to children's literature. Devi Nachiappan is the daughter of popular Tamil poet Azha Valliappa, better known as 'Kuzhandai Kavignar' (Children's poet).

The Yuva Puraskar for 2019 has the highest number of awards for poetry in the country.

Kannada writer Shridhar Banvasi GC who goes by Fakeer won for his novel *Beru*, while Telugu writer Gaddam Mohan Rao won it for *Kongavatu Kathu*. Malayalam writer Anuja Akathootu's *Amma Urangunnila* and Tamil writer Sabarinathan's *Vaal* – both collections of poetry – won awards.

The Bal Sahitya award in Kannada went to Chandrakanth Karadalli's *Kadu Kanasina Beedige*, a novel; while Telugu writer Belagam Bheemeswara Rao's short story collection *Thatha Mata Varaala Moota* won the award.

Popular children's writer Malayath Appunni, now 75 years old, has won several awards including the Kerala Sahitya Akademi for his works.

These awards relate to books first published between January 1, 2013 and December 31, 2017. The prize comprises an engraved copper plaque and a cheque for Rs 50,000.

Awards for Maithili language spoken in Bihar and Jharkhand states will be announced at a later date. The annual award established in 1954 by Government of India aims to promote regional literature in the country through awards, fellowships, grants, publications, literary programmes, workshops and exhibitions. The awards in each language is decided by a jury panel of three members.

Hyderabad: Writers Belegam Bheemesvara Rao from Paravathipuram in Andhra Pradesh and Gaddam Mohan Rao of Telangana state were honoured for their work by the Sahitya Academy on Friday.

Mr Mohan Rao was conferred the Yuva Sahitya Puraskar for his Kongavalu Kathi and Mr Bheemesvara Rao was awarded in the Bal Sahitya category for his collection of short stories, Tatha Maata Varalaa Moota (Grandpa's tales are a treasure trove).

While the Bal Puraskar will be conferred on Children's Day, the day for the Yuva Puraskar is yet to be decided.

Mr Bheemesvara Rao of Vizianagaram district said he was delighted with the announcement of the Bal Sahitya Puraskar.

The 67-year-old retired school assistant has published more than 1,000 books including the short stories, songs and poetry for children.

Tatha Maata Varalaa Moota had 25 short stories on moral values and was published in 2016. He said his first story was published in 1979 and he has since then been researching and writing for children.

He said that the Maharashtra State Bureau of Text Book Production and Curriculum had published his poems and stories after translating them into Marathi.

The Government of India Resolution, which set forth the constitution of the Akademi, described it as a national organisation to work actively for the development of Indian letters and to set high literary standards, to foster and co-ordinate literary activities in all the Indian languages and to promote through them all the cultural unity of the country. Though set up by the Government, the Akademi functions as an autonomous organization. It was registered as a society on 7 January 1956, under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.

Sahitya Akademi, India's National Academy of Letters, is the central institution for literary dialogue, publication and promotion in the country and the only institution that undertakes literary activities in 24 Indian languages, including English.

Over the 64 years of its dynamic existence, it has ceaselessly endeavored to promote good taste and healthy reading habits, to keep alive the intimate dialogue among the various linguistic and literary zones and groups through seminars, lectures, symposia, discussions, readings and performances, to increase the pace of mutual translations through workshops and individual assignments and to develop a serious literary culture through the publications of journals, monographs, individual creative works of every genre, anthologies, encyclopedias, dictionaries, bibliographies, who's who of writers and histories of literature.
